DAN CHELOTTI, JAMES MEETZE, ANDREW MORGAN, & MARK WALLACE

Please join the In Your Ear Reading Series for a reading featuring Dan Chelotti, James Meetze, Andrew Morgan, and Mark Wallace at 3 PM on Sunday, May 19, 2013.

DAN CHELOTTI is the author of x (McSweeney's, 2013) and a chapbook, *The Eights* (Poetry Society of America, 2006). He is an Assistant Professor at Elms College.

JAMES MEETZE's book *Dayglo* was selected by Terrance Hayes as winner of the 2010 Sawtooth Poetry Prize and published by Ahsahta Press. He is also the author of *I Have Designed This for You* (Editions Assemblage, 2007), Serenades (Cy Press, 2004), and editor, with Simon Pettet, of *Other Flowers: Uncollected Poems by James Schuyler* (Farrar, Straus & Giroux, 2010). He is poetry editor of Manor House Quarterly and lives in San Diego, where he is a professor of English at Ashford University and co-curates, with K. Lorraine Graham, the Agitprop Reading and Performance Series.

ANDREW MORGAN is the recipient of a Slovenian Writers' Association Fellowship which sponsored a month-long writing residency in the country's capital city of Ljubljana and has worked as an Editorial Assistant for Verse Magazine as well as an Assistant Managing Editor for Verse Press. He received his MFA from the University of Massachusetts, Amherst where he spent three years as a Juniper Fellow and is currently an Assistant Professor of Writing at New England College in Henniker, New Hampshire. Morgan's

poems have appeared in Pleiades, Conduit, Fairy Tale Review, and many other journals. His first book, *Month of Big Hands*, is available from Natural History Press.

MARK WALLACE is the author of more than fifteen books and chapbooks of poetry, fiction, and essays. Temporary Worker Rides a Subwaywon the 2002 Gertrude Stein Poetry Award and was published by Green Integer Books. His critical articles and reviews have appeared in numerous publications, and he has co-edited two essay collections, Telling It Slant: Avant Garde Poetics of the 1990s, and A Poetics of Criticism. Most recently he has published a novel, The Quarry and The Lot, and a book of poems, Felonies of Illusion. His chapbook The End of America: Book One has just come out with Dusie Kollektiv. He teaches at California State University San Marcos.
